



EKKLĒSIA: CALLED OUT ASSMEBLY (MATTHEW 16:13-20)

Introduction: You may have heard the term before but, what is it? Defining a term by what the words mean is one thing. Seeing it illustrated within the context of what is written broadens our understanding of a term.

I. Ekklēsia: Definition

- A) Thayer's Greek-English Lexicon
 1. "a gathering of citizens called out from their homes into some public place, an assembly"
 2. Compound word formed from 2 other words.
 - (a) *ek* - "out of, from, by, away from"
 - (b) *kaleō* - "to call"
- B) Strong's Greek Dictionary
 1. From a compound of "*ek*" and a derivative of "*kaleō*"; a calling out, that is, (concretely) a popular meeting, especially a religious congregation (Jewish synagogue, or Christian community of members on earth or saints in heaven or both): - assembly, church.

 4. Note: Universal and local church are not the same.
